

Gluten-Free Education Classes



PSV partnered with Children's National Health System to host gluten-free education classes for children and families on "Navigating the Grocery Store in Gluten-Free Style" seminar.

PSV's RX for Food Program: In 2018, PSV Infectious Diseases team, led by Katherine Moyer, DO, Shineca Solomon, BSN, RN, and Pamela Jimenez, CMA, piloted a program along with a few other specialties to screen patients for food insecurity. Food insecurity is defined as limited or uncertain access to enough food. PSV joined local physician, Fred Garner, MD of Burke Pediatrics, and partnered with a local food pharmacy, Food for Others to provide emergency food to families. Food for others also screens families to see if they are eligible for monthly food supplementation through a USDA program. In 2018, 187 PSV families (14% of those that completed the screening) were positive for food insecurity and provided with information to connect with Food for Others. 54 of those families went to Food for Others and 47 qualified for the USDA Program.

These technologies also allow multi-disciplinary genetics care teams like ours at Pediatric Specialists of Virginia to identify and treat these disorders earlier in a child's life, which can positively impact that child's health and well-being immediately and long-term.

Convenient access to genetics experts

The PSV Genetics service connects families with a comprehensive healthcare team that includes nationally recognized geneticists. Each family works closely with a genetics counselor who coordinates with the child's primary care doctor and other care team physicians to identify the genetic testing and treatment services that will work best. The goal is to provide a broad spectrum of care for families to fit the medical and emotional needs of the child.

This full-service program offers diagnosis, treatment, and rehabilitation of infants, children, and adolescents with nearly every kidney disorder and related complications, including (but not limited to):



Multi-specialty clinics

Multi-Specialty Concussion Clinic: A one-stop clinic for children with concussions. PBI Clinic – The Perinatal Brain Injury Clinic is a joint multidisciplinary clinic with neonatal neurology, pediatric physical medicine and rehabilitation and physical therapy for our neurologic patients with cerebal palsy.

Tuberosclerosis Clinic: A multi-specialty clinic offering a wide range of services for children with tuberosclerosis.

Your child's ability to see the world depends on healthy eyes. At PSV, our pediatric ophthalmologists are experts at diagnosing and treating complex eye problems, congenital disorders and rare eye conditions, such as strabismus, childhood cataract and glaucoma.

We offer comprehensive care for patients of all ages, from newborns to young adults.

Leaders in children's eye care: Our program at Children's National Health System (CNHS) and thus PSV, was the first hospital-based pediatric ophthalmology department in the nation. We have a long history working with complex eye conditions and are a recognized leader in the screening and treatment of strabismus, congenital cataract and glaucoma, and retinopathy of prematurity, a disorder that affects premature infants.

Precise diagnosis: Finding the best treatment for your child starts with an accurate and in-depth diagnosis. We are experts in recognizing rare and complex eye problems in newborns, infants and children.

Expertise in rare disorders: Our pediatric ophthalmologists have extensive experience in the diagnosis and treatment of lens abnormalities and childhood cataract, a rare condition that affects only 0.4 percent of children and can be easily misdiagnosed. We are also among the few centers that manage infantile glaucoma, another rare but very serious eye disease.
